

AMHERST CONQUERS COLBY

**Comes Back From Half-Time Tie
to Annex 27-14 Triumph**

AMHERST, Oct. 16—A powerful Amherst College eleven, held to a 7-7 halftime score by the stubborn Colby Mules, roared back with three touchdowns in the last two quarters to win their fourth straight, 27-14, on the victor's Pratt Field.

Halfback Lew Hammond scored the Jeffs' first two touchdowns on a five-yard run and a nine-yard pass reception, while Fullback Dick Simon added the other two on short line bucks. Jake Jordan converted three times in the victory that enabled Amherst to continue its unbeaten record.

Both Colby touchdowns were made on passes from Quarterback George Wales, the first to Jim Lundin for fifteen yards, the second a three-yard toss to Dick King. Ted Shiro added both extra points.
