AMHERST, Mass., Nov. 13—The Amherst Lord Jeffs came from behind today to defeat Williams, 13—7, before 7,800 Alumni Day fans.

The Jeffs spotted their archrivals a score in the second quarter, then rallied in the closing minutes on the half and the opening minutes of the third quarter to gain their sixth victory in eight starts and the runner-up spot in the Little Three Conference.

In the opening minutes of the second frame Stu Duffield, outstanding for Williams at left half, passed to Bud Cool from the Amherst 28 to the one-foot line. Fullback Cliff Farmer then drove over for the touchdown. Ernie Mierzejewski added the conversion.

The Amherst passing attack came to life and, after a punt exchange, put the ball on the Williams' 42. Lew Hammond hit End Andy Scholtz twice in three plays, the two completions carrying to the Williams' seven. From there the Jeffs carried it over in five plays, Dick Simon plunging over for the first of his two touchdowns. The conversion attempt was missed to give Williams the advantage at the half.

In the third period, after a series of punts, Amherst drove 41 yards for the winning touchdown, using all ground plays. Hammond and Simon did most of the carrying, the latter going over in three successive tries from the 8.

Hammond's passes and Simon's plunging were the two best weapons in the Jeffs' attack.

Hammond also excelled in the punting department, with two quick kicks going for 72 and 63 yards.

On defense, By Barnes, at guard, and Tackles Bill Parsons and Jay Geraghty were the bulwarks. Duffield and Halfback Pete Delisser were outstanding for Williams.
